

Minutes of the Garland City Council meeting held on November 2, 2022, at 8:15 pm at the Garland City Building with the following council members present:

Mayor Bourne called the meeting to order. Council Member Howell gave the invocation and Council Member Losee led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council Member Nelson made a motion to approve the agenda. A second was made by Council Member Howell with all council members present voting in favor of the motion.

Mayor Bourne stated that the approval of the minutes was the next item but there were some grammatical errors she would get with Sharlet to correct before they were finalized and signed.

Council Member Howell made a motion to approve the minutes for September 7 and October 19 with said grammatical error changes. A second was made by Council Member Losee with all council members present voting in favor of the motion.

Mayor Bourne asked if there were any open comments from the public.

Rob Johnson commented that there was a gathering at the armory last Saturday that didn't end until 12:30. He stated they had loud music blaring, a lot of kids running around all over, people smoking just outside the door and that he picked up about three twelve packs worth of beer cans behind his house in the parking lot. He also commented that parking has been horrible with wrestling.

Mayor Bourne stated the next item on the agenda was Resolution, R-22-19, updating the emergency chain of command.

A motion was made by Council Member Howell to pass Resolution, R-22-19 establishing the emergency chain of authority. A second was made by Council Member Losee with all council members present voting in favor of the motion.

Mayor Bourne stated under old business was a discussion and vote on a new police vehicle. There was a discussion about a Durango bid with a V8 engine as opposed to a V6 engine.

Council Member Atkinson made a motion to table the vote on the police vehicle at this time. A second was made by Council Member Howell with all council members present voting in favor of the motion.

Mayor Bourne stated under new business was the Mosquito Abatement District tax increase. Mayor Bourne stated that they are looking for a tax increase this year in the amount of \$260,866 to cover costs to maintain current coverage and the increases in fuel and other operating costs. This amount equates to about \$9.00 on a \$400,000 home per year.

Mayor Bourne asked if there were any financial questions. There were none.


Council Member Nelson made a motion to approve the coding for accounts payable and payroll. A second was made by Council Member Atkinson with all council members present voting in favor of the motion.

Mayor Bourne asked if there were any requests for future agenda items. Council Member Atkinson asked about the crosswalks they had talked about and if needed to put it on the agenda for the next meeting. Mayor Bourne stated that she had discussed it with Kade, the public works director and he was going to look at it.

Council Member Nelson stated that a concern has been brought to her about people doing U-turns on 1400 south by the Pie Dump and asked if we could put up a sign and if the police could keep an eye on it.

Mayor Bourne brought up that there is a bunch of surplus equipment at the library so once they get it all gone thru she will bring it before the council. Mayor Bourne also stated that she would like Sharlet to compose a letter to the property owners that live on stub streets about not dumping trash or blocking access to fields.

Council Member Atkinson made a motion to adjourn at 8:50 pm. A second was made by Council Member Howell with all council members present voting in favor of the motion.
