Emergency Preparedness

Thank you to all who joined us this past year in our Preparedness Bingo efforts. This is our last call for November/December.

Last Call-Out: Shelter/Clothing/Fire, \$100 cash - pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters

Shelter/Clothing/Fire

You can only last three to four hours in extreme conditions without adequate shelter. Maintaining your body temperature in hot or cold temperatures is vital for survival. This can be hard to do if you are out of your normal environment or the power to your home is out.

Knowledge of how to maintain your optimal body temperature can help you "Be Ready" to save your life or the life of someone you care about.

DO THIS

- Learn the science of sheltering and layering so you can create lifesaving shelters in any situation, then practice.
- Gather sheltering supplies like blankets, tents, sleeping bags, mylar, cold weather clothing, and clear plastic sheeting. Include sheltering items as needed in your disaster supply kit.
- Learn how to keep your home warm or cool as needed if the power goes out.
- Learn how to safely build, start, and put out a fire using a variety of different starting and extinguishing methods, then practice.

\$100 CASH - pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters

An emergency fund is a savings account containing money to be used only in the event of an emergency. During any incident, whether natural or man-made, it has been shown that the cost of items you need are sometimes determined by the amount of cash you have on hand.

Include in your budget a percentage of each check until you have at least a \$1,000 emergency fund. Keep the cash in small bills and coins and store it with your important documents in the safe.

Collect pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters this month.
