We are grateful for our city workers who have worked tirelessly to keep our roads clear. As community members we can also help by:

- Immediately removing garbage cans from the street after they are emptied.
- Keep vehicles and trailers off the street.
- DO NOT blow or shovel snow into the streets. When plow trucks come by, that snow will be pushed back onto the side of the street where it will have to be removed again. Please blow and shovel snow into your park strip or yard to help keep the road clean.
- Shovel sidewalks so that they will be safe to use.
- Shovel out your mailbox area so that postal workers can safely deliver your mail.
- Adopt a fire hydrant and keep the snow cleared away from it. Property owners with fire hydrants are responsible for keeping them clean and easy to access in emergencies.
- Do not push snow up against the foundation of your home. This may reduce flooding as snow melts.

- Not spayed or neutered - \$15

Please remember to bring your rabies certification information with you.

After March 31, the price doubles.

## Emergency Preparedness

### Water

Water is necessary for life and survival. You are 60 to 70 percent water. It is necessary for all bodily functions.

If you are thirsty, you are already dehydrated.

You can only last three to four days without water. Having a storage of clean drinking water and knowing how to safely treat more is vital to "be ready" for survival.

### Do This:

- Store a MINIMUM of 1 gallon of clean drinking water per person per day.
- Store a MINIMUM 2 week supply (14 gallons each) for you and your family.
- Gather and store water treatment supplies in your disaster supply kits and at home supplies.

- Secure your water heater with earthquake water heater straps.
- Store more water as space, budget, and ability allow.
- BONUS: Store a full month of water for your entire household.
- BONUS: Practice using only your stored water for two or three days. See if you can live on only one gallon of water per person per day.
- BONUS: Learn how to conserve water in an emergency by practicing things like washing dishes and laundry by hand.
