### **Street Improvements/Upcoming Construction**

Garland City will be continuing construction on West Factory Street – Phase 2. Access to West Factory Street will be restricted to farmers and residents who own property there (Road Closed Local Traffic Only signs have been installed), with occasional complete closures of the road. We kindly ask for your cooperation in planning alternate routes and allowing extra travel time during this period. Thank you for your understanding and patience.

### **Emergency Preparedness**

#### **Stay Safe During Extreme Heat**

Extreme heat occurs when temperatures soar above 90°F for two or more days, creating high humidity and putting your health at risk. It's the leading weather-related cause of death annually. Older adults, children, and those with chronic conditions are more vulnerable to extreme heat.

#### **Heat Safety Tips:**

- **Prepare Your Home:**
  - Use fans, but don't rely on them alone.
  - Find community cooling centers like libraries or malls.
  - Cover windows, weather-strip doors, and use window reflectors.
  - Insulate your home and use attic fans.
- **Stay Safe:**
  - Never leave people or pets in a closed car.
  - Wear light, loose clothing and stay hydrated.
  - Use less heat-producing appliances and seek shade if outside.
  - Check on family members and pets regularly.

## Parks and Recreation

## Misc Info

A friendly reminder: Please refrain from watering your lawns between 10 AM and 6 PM to conserve water and ensure efficient use. Watering during these hours can lead to increased evaporation and reduced effectiveness.

Starting in September, the Box Elder County Landfill will be open every Saturday from 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM. All loads arriving at the landfill must be covered and secured.

Utah Tarp Law - Any vehicle carrying dirt, sand, gravel, rock fragments, pebbles, crushed base, aggregate, or any other similar materials, or scrap metal shall have a covering over the entire load unless:

- The highest point of the load does not extend above the top of any exterior wall or sideboard of the cargo compartment of the vehicle.
- The outer edges of the load are at least six inches below the top inside edges of the exterior walls or sideboards of the cargo compartment of the vehicle.
